

Alternative diagnostic imaging available during radioactive isotope shortage

To offset the impact of the current Technetium (Tc-99m) shortage (the main isotope used in nuclear medicine scans), the Department of Health has added temporary nuclear medicine diagnostic imaging items to the Medicare Benefits Schedule.

Until Tc-99m supply returns to normal, GPs are advised to discuss the availability of alternative diagnostic imaging with their patients at the time of referral and continue to refer patients for standard tests which will be determined by the radiology provider.

The Tc-99m shortage is a result of a recent mechanical failure at Australia's Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation. It is still unknown how long the shortage will last.

Fiona Stanley Hospital

New rapid access giant cell arteritis clinic

Fiona Stanley Hospital and Royal Perth Hospitals are combining to provide patients living in both catchments with early access, investigation and management of suspected giant cell arteritis.

Inclusion criteria includes:

- Aged over 50 years
- Presence of suggestive features e.g. new headache, jaw claudication, scalp sensitivity, tenderness over the temporal arteries, fever, visual disturbance, PMR, raised ESR/CRP
- No other more likely diagnosis
- Within the SMHS or EMHS catchment (and related country areas).

To refer:

1. Call the on-call rheumatology registrar (in hours) or consultant after hours via the RPH switchboard on 9224 2244 to discuss the referral, whether to start steroids and for an appointment time to be allocated.

- (attached to the on-line referral form) should be given to the patient with the appropriate clinic time ticked.

The on call rheumatology registrar/consultant should still be called for referrals for all patients with suspected giant cell arteritis. Patients with transient or persistent loss of vision, for whom immediate review in clinic is not available, may be advised to attend the RPH ED for urgent assessment. Other patients will be seen at RPH within 72 hours of referral whenever possible.

Endocrinology Department

The Endocrinology Department at Rockingham General Hospital offers public patients living in the Rockingham and Peel region access to endocrinologists, diabetes educators, a dietician, a podiatrist and a psychologist. The department offers care of patients with type 1 diabetes (including insulin pumps), complex type 2 diabetes, gestational diabetes, thyroid, pituitary, adrenal, bone and gonadal disorders.

Following assessment, patients can be further supported through the Diabetes Telehealth Clinic, the Diabetes Complications Screening Clinic, SMART1E education program for adults with type 1 diabetes, or clinical psychologist review.

Referral for endocrinologist-led diabetes and endocrinology clinics is through CRS. Referral for diabetes educators, the dietitian or the podiatrist is direct to RGH via fax on 9599 4737. For urgent referrals, please call a consultant Endocrinologist to discuss the patient, and fax the referral directly to RGH on 9599 4737. A consultant endocrinologist is also available Tuesday to Friday (during normal working hours) for advice via the hospital switchboard on 9559 4000.

Mental Health Week 2019

Mental Health Week (October 6 to 12) is a good opportunity for GPs to undertake self-directed learning to support their key role in identifying and treating depression. WA Primary Health Alliance has developed a suite of resources to assist GPs in identifying and treating depression in primary care. The guideline, developed by the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia, is intended to improve clinical care for patients and support antimicrobial stewardship.

Type1Screen offers free type 1 diabetes risk screening for two to 30 year olds who have a family member with type 1 diabetes. People who are found to test positive are monitored closely and, if they develop type 1 diabetes, will be offered education and started on insulin early to avoid serious illness.
